Welcome to the 24th Annual Head of the Cuyahoga Regatta (HOTC) hosted by the Cleveland Rowing Foundation (CRF). Last year's HOTC attracted 53 clubs comprising more than 2,000 rowers, and this year's event will be even bigger. We are thrilled to have so many competitors, fans and exhibitors join us for a great day of racing on the Cuyahoga River.

To Native Americans who lived here on the southern shores of Lake Erie, the word Cuyahoga meant "crooked river," and if you look at a map of the race course with its five major turns, you will realize that it more than lives up to its name. The river's winding path makes this a challenging race for even the most experienced crews and scullers. Good luck to all competitors as they navigate the river and take an early season test of their endurance and skill.

Rivergate Park is home to the Cleveland Rowing Foundation's Boathouses and is headquarters for four collegiate crew teams, the Western Reserve Rowing Association adult programs, and four scholastic crews, featured in our renovated lobby.

Since last year's HOTC, in order to meet the needs of our continually growing membership, the Cleveland Rowing Foundation has made additional updates to its lobby and renovated the second floor to provide an additional office and a larger meeting space. Starting in late September, CRF will begin offering off season classes, including yoga and nutrition. These improvements continue to help us better serve Cleveland's growing rowing community and reinforce

Rivergate Park's reputation as the premier spot for active recreation on the Cuyahoga.

We hope you not only enjoy the racing but also find time to visit our vendors and Beer Garden, located near the racing recovery dock. The Beer Garden will be open from 11:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m., and will be serving Pirate Light, Hop Goblin (an IPA), and Subchaser (a Heifer Wiesen), all from the Rocky River Brewing Company.







Rowing in Cleveland

The Cleveland Rowing Foundation

The Western Reserve Rowing Association (WRRA) was established at a location adjacent to Carter Road Bridge in 1989 as a non-profit corporation by five people who had rowed in the for-profit Flats Racing League, which had been established in 1988. As the Flats Racing League ended its run, WRRA began its Summer Rowing League in 1993, and remains one of the country's largest summer rowing programs.

Due to the growth of the organization, the Western Reserve Rowing Foundation (WRRF) was formed as an umbrella organization for the collection of high school, collegiate, and adult crew programs. It was established as a non-profit 501(c)3 dedicated to competitive and recreational racing and the expansion of the sport of rowing in the Greater Cleveland area, with a focus on youth rowing.

In 2003, WRRF changed its name, becoming the Cleveland Rowing Foundation (CRF) and revised its governance structure to officers and a board of directors that included rowing representatives as well as community and corporate directors. CRF moved into a new 11,000 square foot facility in the summer of 2004, directly adjacent to its existing boat bays. This new facility included staff offices, a workout facility, and a Common Room that could accommodate 100-plus.

As the organization continued to grow, the CRF Board of Directors began a search for a new home along the Cuyahoga River that would accommodate the needs of its member organizations and secure the future of rowing in Cleveland. Partnering with The Trust for Public Land and with a generous donation from the Gund Foundation, the former Commodore Club Marina was purchased in 2010, which included 6.5 acres of land and a 19,000 square foot building. By the beginning of the 2011 rowing season, CRF was situated in its new location and is part of Rivergate Park. In 2015, an additional boat house consisting of 6,500 square feet was added.

Today, CRF is comprised of eight member organizations, serving over 1,500 high school, collegiate and adult rowers.



Head of the Cuyahoga Regatta

In 1989, WRRA hosted the very first Cleveland Sprints Regatta inside the breakwall on Lake Erie. In 1996, the Cleveland Sprints Regatta was moved from Lake Erie to the Cuyahoga River, and the distance was changed from a 2,000 meter sprint to a 2.5 mile head race, marking the beginning of what is known today as the Head of the Cuyahoga Regatta. The initial head race, which was included as a Cleveland Bicentennial event, involved over 250 rowers and 3,000 spectators. The race has continued to grow and is now a 5,000 meter race. In 2018, hosted over 2,200 athletes in over 525 entries from 53 clubs, 38 cities, 11 states and Canada, and is currently the sixth largest Regatta in the country.
