ELIGIBILITY

All athletes must be registered with their Provincial Sports Organization and Rowing Canada Aviron (RCA).

ENTRIES

All entries must be completed on Regatta Central.

DEADLINES

Note: Late entries will be permitted until all lanes are filled. No additional races will be included.

A minimum of three entries must be received in a specific event to constitute a race.

Junior A	18 th birthday during the year 2022 or younger
Junior B	16 th birthday during the year 2022 or younger
Junior C	14 th birthday during the year 2022 or younger
Lightweight	individual maximums; Men - 72.5kg, Women - 59kg, no averages
Novice	Started rowing after September 1, 2021

Note: RCA and Rowing BC seat fees of \$3.50 each will apply.

Fees are due in full prior to the start of the regatta. No crews will be allowed on the water from a club whose fees have not been paid. There will be no refund of entry fees should weather conditions cause cancellation of races - all expenses are incurred prior to the event.

RACE SCHEDULE

The preliminary race schedule will be available April 4, 2022 on Regatta Central. The final schedule will be available April 7, 2022 on Regatta Central. The racing format is timed finals for all events. Where there is more than one race in an event, the fastest time of the entered crews is declared the winner.

COACHES MEETING

The coaches meeting will be via zoom at 7:30pm on Friday April 8, 2022. All coaches, coxswains and bow-persons are encouraged to attend. A WhatsApp Group will be setup for the day of the regatta for any communications.

LIGHTWEIGHT WEIGH-INS

There is two windows for lightweight weigh-ins, 7 - 9am and 12 - 1pm, the day of the regatta at the front of the boat bay. Athletes will weigh-in as crews.



RACE COURSE

The race course is 1500m in length using an albano lane system. Each lane is lined by buoys on each side except for the 1 exterior lane, resulting in a 7 lane course. Larger buoys are positioned at the start, 250m, 500m, 750m, 1000m, 1250m and finish at the outermost limits of the course. Please view the map posted on [Regatta Central](#) and at the main tent for warm-up area and flow pattern.

RESULTS AND AWARDS

Results will only be posted to the Maple Bay Rowing Club website (link will be available of Regatta Central). Ribbons will be awarded to first, second and third place crews in each event.

SAFETY

- All boats must have a secure bow ball and heel restraints to allow "hand-free" release (ties no more than 7cm). All boats will be inspected prior to launching.
- No boat in the staging area is permitted to go 200m beyond (North of) the start line.

MEDICAL SERVICES

First aid will be provided to all competitors on site. For serious cases, 9-1-1 will be contacted.

SECURITY

For trailers arriving on the Friday evening, security will be provided for supervision over night. The Maple Bay Rowing Club and its volunteers do not assume any responsibility for the equipment. There is no security provided following the completion of the regatta.
