



## Midwest Championship Erg Sprint Points System

Points will be awarded in descending order from 6-1 to the top six finishers in each race that qualifies for the junior point championship. If there are six or fewer rowers in a race the last-place rower will be awarded no points. Several possible points distributions are as follows:

For races with six or more:

1<sup>st</sup>—6pts  
2<sup>nd</sup>—5pts  
3<sup>rd</sup>—4pts  
4<sup>th</sup>—3pts  
5<sup>th</sup>—2pts  
6<sup>th</sup>—1pt  
7<sup>th</sup>—0pts

For races with six rowers:

1<sup>st</sup>—6pts  
2<sup>nd</sup>—5pts  
3<sup>rd</sup>—4pts  
4<sup>th</sup>—3pts  
5<sup>th</sup>—2pts  
6<sup>th</sup>—1pt

For races with five:

1<sup>st</sup>—6pts  
2<sup>nd</sup>—5pts  
3<sup>rd</sup>—4pts  
4<sup>th</sup>—3pts  
5<sup>th</sup>—0pts

Points earned in the following events will count towards the High School championship:

Junior Novice Ltwt Men  
Junior Novice Ltwt Women  
Junior Novice Open Men  
Junior Novice Open Women  
Junior Ltwt Men  
Junior Ltwt Women  
Junior Open Men  
Junior Open Women

In the event of a tie in an individual race, both rowers will receive points. Ex:

1<sup>st</sup>—6pts  
t-2<sup>nd</sup>—5pts  
t-2<sup>nd</sup>—5pts  
4<sup>th</sup>—3pts  
5<sup>th</sup>—2pts  
6<sup>th</sup>—1pt  
7<sup>th</sup>—0pts

In the event of a tie in total points, the school with the most 1st place finishes will be declared the winner. In the even of a further tie in the number of 1st place finishes, the winner will be determined by most 2nd place finishes and so on.
