REGATTA INFORMATION

The RowOn Beach Sprint Championships is an annual event for athletes representing clubs in Ontario and beyond. The main objective of this event is to crown provincial champions in eight beach sprint events, and to provide a quality race experience for athletes, coaches, and umpires as the new Beach Sprints discipline continues to grow and gain momentum.

DAY OF COMPETITION – SCHEDULE INFORMATION

 a) Coach/Participant Meeting – A Course Overview Meeting will be held on Friday, June 21st at 7:00pm at Lakeside Beach Park. A mandatory Coaches/Participants Meeting will be held at 7:45 am on Saturday, June 22nd at the Start/Finish Line. The Friday meeting is not mandatory.

ALL clubs are required to have at least 1 representative at the Coaches/Participants Meeting on Saturday, for instructions from the Regatta Chair and Chief Umpire, as per Rule 8.6 of the 2022 RCA Rules of Racing.

As per Rule 8.6 in the Rowing Canada Rules of Racing, the Chief Umpire may penalize a club for failure to attend the Coaches/Participants Meeting, including not permitting the club to race. The Club representative in attendance is responsible for conveying all information from the meeting to all participating athletes and coaches. All participants are expected to be familiar with the information conveyed at the Coaches/Participants meeting.

b) Race Schedule – Solo races (CW1x, CM1x, CJW1x, CJM1x) and double races (CMix2x, CJW2x, CJM2x, CJMix2x) will all take place on Saturday. The Time Trials for solo events will take place in the morning, with Repechages, Quarterfinals, Semifinals, and Finals for solo events following the last Time Trial.





Once all solo races are complete, the Time Trials for double races will take place in the afternoon, followed by Repechages, Quarterfinals, Semifinals, and Finals. The final race schedule will be posted on Regatta Central, along with the draw on June 18th, and is dependent on numbers of entries in each event.

- c) Minimum Race Intervals The minimum race interval will be 7-minutes.
- d) Course practice times All equipment is supplied for this regatta, so training will be limited. There will be a training session on Friday, June 21st from 4:00pm to 7:00pm for competitors to come out and try the boats. There will also be a short training session on Saturday, June 22nd from 7:00am to 8:00am. Competitors must register by email to <u>kate@rowontario.ca</u> if they would like to train during these periods. They should also indicate whether they would like to use a solo or double boat. Short training periods will be allocated to accommodate as many crews as possible.
- e) Regatta Office Hours Any issues, questions, or concerns can be addressed in-person at the Regatta Office, operating out of the Event Tent, from 7:00am onward on regatta day, or by calling 905-321-5025. This number will be active from 4:00pm to 7:00pm on Friday, June 16th and from 6:00am onward on regatta day.

ELIGIBILITY

All events are open to participants from any Club in the world. Athletes and listed Coaches must be listed on their Club's Regatta Central roster. Crews composed of members of different clubs ("composite crews") are permitted.

a) Ontario Participants	 Registered and active member of a Row Ontario member club in the appropriate role (e.g. Athlete or Coach) Registrations must be activated in the RCA Web Registration System to be valid
 b) Canadian Participants, outside Ontario 	 Registered and active member of a member club in the appropriate role (e.g. Athlete or Coach) Registrations must be activated in the RCA Web Registration System to be valid
c) International Participants	 Registered with the appropriate National Rowing Federation Complete the online waiver in Regatta Central by Friday, June 21st.
d) Age Categories	 Age is calculated as of December 31st, 2024. Under 19 (U19) – open to eligible athletes born in 2006 or later; Open – open to all eligible athletes.





e) Mixed	• Mixed events must include no more than half male-identifying athletes.
f) Composite	• Composite crews must include athletes from at least two different Clubs, each of whom meet the eligibility requirements listed above.

ACCEPTABLE FORMS OF PROOF OF AGE AND IDENTITY

Rowers, in U19 events, will be required to provide proof of age. As per Rule 2.3, identification, including nongovernment issued identification, will only be accepted if it includes the athlete's birthdate <u>AND</u> photo. If two pieces of identification are required to meet these requirements, competitors are required to show both to the Regatta Chair for verification, prior to presenting at Control Commission. Competitors in open events may be asked to present photo identification at Control Commission. For all athletes, a photo of identification on a cell phone will be accepted, so long as it is clear and has no evidence of tampering.

ENTRY DEADLINES AND PAYMENT TERMS

All entries and all payment of entry fees will be completed through Regatta Central, without exception. Entries, completed in full, must be submitted online by Sunday, June 16th at 11:59PM.

Entries will only be accepted with full payment. Any entries for which payment has not been received will be deleted after the deadline.

A preliminary draw will be posted on Regatta Central on Tuesday, June 18th. Any further updates will be published on Regatta Central.

- b) Late Entries Applications for late entries may be submitted through Regatta Central until Friday, June 21st at 4:00pm. Late entries are subject to approval by the Regatta Chair. The cost of a late entry will be 1.5x the cost of the base entry fee, plus seat fees. The late entry fee must accompany the late entry for the entry to be accepted, without exception.
- c) Substitutions In the case of an athlete substitution, the substitute must meet all eligibility and entry requirements as listed above. A \$5.00 Name Change Fee will be assessed for all name changes unless a





note from a qualified medical professional is emailed to <u>kate@rowontario.ca</u> by 5:00pm on Monday, June 24th, 2024.

Substitution requests will only be accepted until 2 hours before the posted start time, within the following windows:

d) Scratches – All scratches submitted after the entry deadline will be assessed a \$50.00 + HST Scratch fee. The Club whose crews miss the start of their race for any reason will also be assessed a \$50.00 + HST Scratch fee. Scratch fees will be waived for medical reasons if a note from a qualified medical professional is emailed to <u>kate@rowontario.ca</u> by 5:00pm on Monday, June 24th, 2024.

RCA RULES OF RACING EXCEPTIONS

This regatta will follow the 2022 Rowing Canada Aviron Rules of Racing, with the exceptions (per Rule 1.6) noted below.

- Appendix 4, Rule 13b Once the runner has exited the water, boat handlers must remain in control of the boat and shall not assist or run with the crew member to the finish. Penalty for a boat handler not remaining in control of the boat once the athlete starts the run is exclusion.
- Appendix 4, Rule 13b(i) Runners shall not receive any physical guidance or assistance from a team member who is on the field of play. For Mixed events, excluding para events, the runners at the start and finish must be two different runners, with one being a male and the other being a female. Penalty for breaking this rule is exclusion.
- Appendix 4, Rule 13c The Starter will be at ground level and clearly visible to the rowers.

PROGRESSION SYSTEM

For this event, the Progression System will use a combination of Time Trials and Elimination Heats, which may or may not include Repêchages. The Progression System will be designed to give all competitors a minimum of two races (including Time Trials) and to reduce the competitors to a Final group of eight. The detailed Progression System will be posted on Regatta Central.

TIME PENALTIES

Crews not correctly rounding any buoy on the course or marker on land shall be awarded a time penalty as follows:





- Not correctly rounding the first or second buoy from the beach 30 seconds for each instance;
- Not correctly rounding the third buoy from the beach 60 seconds; and,
- Not correctly rounding the markers for landing at the beach and running on the beach 60 seconds.

NEW IN 2024

There are two new rules in 2024, in alignment with changes to the World Rowing Rules of Racing. These rule changes are outlined in the Exceptions to the RCA Rules of Racing above. **Violations of these rules will result in exclusion from racing.**

- Boat handlers must remain in control of the boat once the runner has exited the water. They shall not assist or run with the runner.
- For Mixed events, excluding para events, the runners at the start and finish must be two different runners, with one being male and the other being female.

BOAT HANDLERS & EQUIPMENT

Crews should arrange for their own boat handlers. The Organizing Committee may be able to provide volunteer boat handlers, but availability is not guaranteed.

Boats will be provided. Rigging will be fixed and cannot be changed. Rowers must provide or arrange to borrow sculls.

RESULTS AND MEDALS

Results will be posted online using Regatta Central, upon the completion of racing.

1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prizes will be awarded in each of the categories listed in the Event List above. For a 1st, 2nd, and 3rd place prize to be awarded in a category, there will need to be a minimum of four boats that race in that category. If there are only three boats, only a 1st and 2nd place prize will be awarded. If just two boats, only the 1st place prize will be awarded.
