2.0 Event Dates

Friday, October 25th (9:00am to 5:30pm) & Saturday, October 26th, 2024 (8:30am to 1:30pm). Start and end times are approximate and subject to change, based on numbers of entries and depending on weather conditions.

3.0 Championship Facility Information

Address: Henley Island Dr, St. Catharines, ON L2N 4P5

Course Distance: 2,200 meters

Race Distance: 2,000 meters for Championship (Varsity) and Junior Varsity (JV) events; 1000m for Novice events

Athletes drop off & parking: parking is available in the parking lot behind the boathouses for athletes, coaches, volunteers, umpires, and buses.

Tow vehicles are permitted to park with their trailer in the trailer area.

Site Access: The dock will only be permitted to athletes, coaches, and designated volunteers and staff. Spectators are not permitted on the dock. Please see <u>Regatta Central</u> for a course map. All athletes and crews will follow posted flow patterns.





4.0 Entry Fees and Deadlines

The entry fees for the 2024 OUA Rowing Championships will be cost-shared by the attending institutions.

The entry fee for the 2024 OUA Rowing Championships is:

- Varsity entries: \$550 + HST / gender + applicable seat fees
- Development entries: \$400 + HST / gender + applicable seat fees

This fee covers equipment costs, facility rental, and umpires and regatta officials. Payment by credit card at time of entry is preferred, but Row Ontario can send an invoice pre-championship.

OUA Eligibility Deadline: October 15th 11:59PM

Entry Deadline: October 16th 11:59PM

All entries will be completed using Regatta Central. An entry is only valid when all crew members are named.

A complete team roster of all athletes eligible to compete in the OUA rowing championships must be submitted to CJ Ireland (<u>cirelan5@uwo.ca</u>) and Andrew Backer (<u>andrew@rowontario.ca</u>) by October 16th at 11:59pm. Only athletes listed on the roster may compete or be used as a spare or substitute in any entry for any reason.

Substitutions: After entries close, and prior to racing beginning, a maximum of 50% of a crew or the single may be substituted from the original team roster. Name changes must be submitted, using the Name Change Form found on Regatta Central, at least two hours prior to racing. No substitution of rowers may be made in a crew which has already raced in their heat of the event, except in the case of illness or injury, in which case a medical attestation shall be obtained, and the crew change shall be provided to the Organizing Committee for consideration. A rower who has been replaced may no longer compete in the regatta even if the rower is restored to health. No substitute is permitted for a single sculler who has already competed in the heat of the event.

5.0 Eligibility

Please refer to the <u>2024 OUA Rowing Rules and Regulations</u> and <u>Ontario University Development Event Regulations</u> for specific information related to eligibility.

Weight-restricted events:

- Lightweight Women 59kg maximum
- Lightweight Men 72.5kg maximum





Coxswains: 55kg minimum

6.0 Check-in & Coaches Meeting

Eligible Photo ID: All competitors will be required to show photo ID at Control Commission prior to launching. A Student Identification card or a photo of ID on a cell phone will be accepted, so long as it is clear and has no evidence of tampering.

Regatta Coaches Technical Meeting: Friday, October 25th at the Control Commission, one hour before the first race. If required, there will be a Regatta Finals Technical Meeting on Saturday, October 26th, one hour prior to the first final.

ALL clubs are required to have at least 1 representative at the coaches meeting, for instructions from the Regatta Chair and Chief Umpire, as per Rule 8.6 of the 2022 RCA Rules of Racing.

As per Rule 8.6 in the Rowing Canada Rules of Racing, the Chief Umpire may penalize a club for failure to attend the coaches meeting, including not permitting the club to race. The Club representative in attendance is responsible for conveying all information from the coaches meeting to all participating athletes and coaches. All participants are expected to be familiar with the information conveyed at the coaches meeting.

Hardcopies of the draw will not be distributed. The draw, progressions and results will be available online in Regatta Central and through WhatsApp four [4] days in advance of the regatta.

Course Practice Time: There is no official regatta training time. Coaches of crews wishing to train on Thursday can contact Katie Bruggeling-Lavoie (kbruggeling@brocku.ca) at Brock University to make arrangements.

Events will run in 15-minute intervals, with race intervals of no less than 6 minutes. This is subject to change, if entries dictate less time is required.

A Para event (or series of Para events) will be included in the schedule if entries warrant. Para rowers must meet the criteria set out in the FISA Para Rowing Classification Regulations but are not required to obtain classification prior to the event. Coaches should email <u>Andrew Backer</u> before submitting a Para entry to discuss event designation, if applicable.

Please note that, new in 2024, Novice events will be contested over 1000m. Novice races will start at the 2000m start line and finish at the 1000m mark.

Finals for Development events will take place immediately following completion of the last heat. Heats for Saturday's Championship event finals will take place on Friday afternoon, beginning immediately following the completion of the last Development race.

Saturday, October 26th:

Finals for the Championship events will begin at 8:30am. Events will run in 15-minute intervals, with race intervals of no less than 6 minutes.

The official weigh-in for all lightweights and coxswains will be held starting 2 hours prior to the first lightweight race and shall remain open for 2.5 hours. Weigh-ins will take place upstairs in the boathouse. Lightweight competitors must weigh-in for weight restricted events that they are competing in, but they do not have to weigh-in as a crew. Coxswains in Championship events must weigh-in for coxed events that





they are competing in, but they do not have to weigh-in with their crew. Coxswains in Development events do not need to weigh-in. There is a practice scale available between the boathouses on Henley Island.

Athletes and crews will be permitted to launch no earlier than 60 minutes prior to their posted start time and no later than 20 minutes prior to their posted start time.

8.0 Sport Specific Rules and Officials

The 2022 RCA Rules of Racing will be in effect at this regatta, with the following exceptions:

2.3 Categories of Rowers and Proof of Age and Identity

The OUA Rowing Championships follows OUA eligibility requirements, not RCA categories. A valid student card will be accepted as photo identification at this regatta.

2.5 & 2.6 Weighing of Coxswains

Coxswains competing in Development events will not be required to weigh-in.

2.11 Weighing of Athletes in Weight-Restricted Events

All athletes racing in weight-restricted events must weigh-in, but athletes will not be required to weigh-in as a crew.

3.1 Classes of Boats

PR3 1x entries will be accepted at this regatta.

9.6 Adverse Weather Conditions and Fairness Committee

The Fairness Committee will be comprised of the Chief Umpire, Regatta Chair, and two coaches (one selected by the host institution, and one selected at the Coaches' Meeting by a majority vote of all participating institutions). The Chief Umpire, in consultation with the Fairness Committee, will determine relevant changes to the program if action is required to ensure safety.

10.17 Penalties

As well as the penalties outlined in the 2022 RCA Rules of Racing in relation to said rules, Section 6.4 in the <u>OUA Rowing Rules & Regulations</u> outlines additional penalties that may be applied at the discretion of the OUA Discipline Committee.

9.0 Medical Services

A clearly marked medical building, staffed with a certified first aid person, is located beside the boathouses. The first aid person will also have access to a coach boat to assist an athlete on the water with immediate need.





10.0 Site Amenities

Please note there will be no food vendors at this regatta. Competitors are encouraged to bring their own water; there is access to a water hose at the boat house and there will be bottles of water available in case of emergency at the Start, Finish, and Medical.

There is limited indoor shelter available at the regatta site. The regatta may be canceled or postponed in the event of seriously inclement weather. Clubs are recommended to bring their own tents in the event of rain/sun etc. Trailer sites will be large enough to accommodate trailers and a shelter structure.

11.0 Ticketing

13.0 Awards Presentation

Gold, silver, and bronze medals will be awarded on Friday afternoon, for Development events. OUA gold, silver, and bronze medals for crew members and coxswains in Championship events, along with Team Championship banners, Athletes of the Year, and Coaches of the Year awards, will be presented at the Control Commission beginning one hour following the completion of the last race on Saturday.

14.0 Accommodation

Participating teams are responsible for their own accommodations.

15.0 Equipment

Participating teams are responsible for providing their own equipment. No equipment, including oars, shoes etc., will be permitted to be left at the dock area.

17.0 Volunteers

Participating member institutions must supply volunteers to assist throughout the championship. A volunteer schedule will be sent to each school prior to the championship by the Host Convenor, and must be completed and sent back prior to the race schedule being released. The number of volunteers will be based upon the number of varsity entries each school submits, based on the following ratios:

1-4 entries: 1 volunteer
5-8 entries: 2 volunteers
9-12 entries: 3 volunteers
13-16 entries: 4 volunteers
17-20 entries: 5 volunteers

Duties will include boat holding, safety boat driving, helping with results and information posting, and other responsibilities yet to be determined. Information regarding volunteer sign-up will be distributed separately.
