HISTORY & VENUE

The Iowa Chase is a USRowing Registered event hosted by the University of Iowa. This regatta was created to bring a head race back to the Iowa City area, in the spirit of the retired Head of the Iowa. That event took place at the end of October on the Iowa River, through the middle of campus.

Due to ever changing river conditions, we have moved the race to the Coralville Lake Reservoir. We thank the Army Corps of Engineers for allowing us to hold this race, located just 5 miles north of campus. This site allows for ample trailer parking, dock, and beach access, as well as plenty of room to grow the event for the future. The race is 4600m (about 2.86 mi).

COVID-19

We will follow university, state, and local guidelines related to COVID-19. Currently:

The Board of Regents, State of Iowa currently prohibits the public universities from mandating face masks. Face masks are encouraged, but not mandatory.

Even if you are fully vaccinated, you should feel comfortable continuing to wear a mask if you choose.

The University of Iowa strongly encourages the university community to get vaccinated. State law (HF 889) prohibits Iowa's public university from requiring proof of vaccination. The university is obligated to follow the law.

We are fortunate to be an outdoor sport, and we have plenty of space for each program, including trailer and boat storage space, as well as team tent areas.

REGATTA CENTRAL

Regatta Central will serve as the main site for information regarding the regatta. If planning to attend the regatta, add the regatta to your Regatta Central Dashboard to receive updates and additional information as we near the event.

All boats must be registered online by the standard deadline. Late entries may be accepted by email at the discretion of the Regatta Director. An additional fee will be applied.

Registration opens September 1. Early Entry Deadline is September 30. Standard Entry Deadline is October 7th at Midnight.

Payments & Line ups are due October 7th at Midnight.

RACE INFORMATION, RULES, PROCEDURES

REGISTRATION PACKET, SEEDING, BOW NUMBERS & WAIVERS

Each team will be responsible for picking up your Regatta Packet, including bow numbers, 2 hours prior to your first event. The registration pavilion will be open at 7am on race day.

First place finishes in respective events will lead their race and be first off, the line. All other seedings will be random. We will attempt to align boats by ranking and program. So, A boats with A boats, D boats follow D boats. A program that does not rank their crews will be randomly assigned anywhere among the field in the event.

Due to COVID-19, and to reduce waste, we will not be issuing bibs for racers.

Bow numbers should be returned immediately after racing and while leaving the dock area. \$10 will be charged/invoiced to any crew not returning a bow number. Medals will not be released until bow numbers are returned.

Waivers: The University of Iowa requires **two** waivers to be signed to compete.

- 1) USRowing Waiver
- 2) Iowa Chase Release Waiver.

Both must be submitted prior to racing. Anyone racing without signed waivers will result in a team/boat disqualification. To ensure successful USRowing clearance, please make sure your athlete roster is updated through the USRowing portal, including merging, or deleting duplicate memberships for athletes.

PRE-RACE MEETING

Due to COVID-19, only coaches or their designated representatives will meet for a brief race meeting at 7am on race day. The individuals present will be responsible for relaying information to their programs. We encourage each program to share information regarding the racecourse, as well as dock procedures prior to getting hands on.

EVENT DEFINITIONS

Open/Collegiate: Rowers who have graduated high school. No Youth are allowed to row or cox in this event. This group will include all collegiate crews, as well as anyone in the master's category choosing to race in this category. There will be no handicaps.

Masters: Limited to competitors who have attained or will attain the age of 21 during the current calendar year. Handicaps are assigned based on age rounded down, using the USRowing handicap formula. Coxswains do not need to be a Master.

Youth: Athletes who are (in the current calendar year) 19 or younger and are currently enrolled in Middle or High School are allowed to race in this event. Coxswains do not need to be Youth. No youth athlete may race in any other event classification, unless as a coxswain in a master's event.

Mixed Events: Must have 50/50 ratio of men and women, or a ratio of more women rowers than men.

Novice: First year rowing.

DOCKING/WET LAUNCHING

The Beach area will be used for Launch/Return for all crews. Plan for sand to get to the docks (or water for wet launching). We will have hoses to spray out your boats.

We will have one dock – extended and wide- for launching and returning crews. Wet docking is an option for all crews. Notify the Dock Master if your crew is doing so.

Only <u>two</u> coaches/athletes allowed on the dock per crew. This is for the safety of all athletes, as well as to speed the process of crews on and off the water. There will be volunteers to help land and assist boats.

Crews will have 2 minutes once their boat is in the water on the dock to get in and shove off. Do not tie in or adjust until you have pulled away from the launch/return area.

Oar staging area – oars will have a staging area near the docks for easy access.

Hot Seating: if hot seating for a race, either personnel or boat, please 1) Notify the Regatta Director prior to the race 2) Notify the Dock Master. You will receive a "hot seating card" that must be put in the air by the coxswain (or rower) upon return to the dock. This card will alert regatta staff that your boat needs to get in. All hot seating boats must wet dock/launch. Any rowers/equipment making an exchange needs to be ready to switch with returning crew. You are still required to be at the start on time. No exceptions. Pay attention to the race schedule.

<u>Launching Instructions:</u> Once off the dock, proceed immediately and directly across the launch/return area. Watch other crews. Tie in and make any adjustments. Turn toward Port and proceed to the Start. The start line is 5k from the docks. Plan accordingly with your time frame to get to the start on time.

<u>Return Instructions:</u> Upon crossing the finish line, immediately paddle and drop out rowers if needed to slow boat speed. Keep moving. If using the dock, you will land on the side closest to the racecourse unless directed elsewhere by the Dock Master. Proceed carefully, communicate with other crews, and obey Dock Master to land. Be prepared to do a partial spin when approaching the dock, with Starboards backing and Ports rowing. Use your bow rowers to steer and get you on point into the docks, and your stern rowers to finish the landing.

<u>Launch Schedule:</u> Announcements will be made for launch. 1st call, 2nd call and Last Call. To keep the race on schedule, we want to keep all events launching together. We have made improvements to our announcing platform and speaker system for this coming year.

WARM-UP/RACECOURSE

Coralville Lake is a large, wide lake, with green banks and rock walls. The fall foliage will be peaking. With that said, due to the width of the lake, we want to keep the warm-up and racing lanes along the southwest shoreline, splitting the lake in half.

Warm-up crews should proceed to the start while following to the Right/Starboard side of the racecourse buoy line. Do not cross the line and be aware of racers who may get off course.

When arriving at the starting area, proceed above the start line and pass the Marshall launch to enter the staging area. During this time, get yourself aligned in numerical order. All crews should know your bow number, as well as the crew immediately ahead and behind you in the starting order. Line up in sequential order, increasing numerically.

Arrive at the staging area 10 minutes prior to your race in order to get turned around and in alignment.

The race officials will call you to the start. When you pass the start pontoon boat, you should be at full pressure. The officials will say "Mark" once you cross the start.

Crews will be called to the start at 10 second intervals. Be ready to move once instructed to do so.

Once you are on the course, look ahead to find your point. Red Buoys will mark each 1,000m. Yellow/White Buoys will mark 500m intervals and help with any bends in the lake.

Communicate clearly as a coxswain or bow seat with other crews if needed in the event of overtaking or course adjustments.

Penalties:

- 1:00 Crossing the Buoy Line at any time. There is enough room for passing in the warm-up and race lanes. The fastest course is not on the buoy line for racing.
- :30 Interference with another crew resulting in a boat collision. (Not all clashing of oars, or accidental interference will result in a penalty. A malicious and irresponsible interference will be penalized.)
- :15 Not yielding to overtaking crew.

Any crew displaying unsportsmanlike conduct will be disqualified to include disregard for safety, disrespectful behavior toward regatta staff, race officials or competitors.

The Race Officials reserve the right to penalize any other violation as deemed necessary and appropriate.

MEDALS

Race medals will be awarded once all results have been finalized and released. Coaches and/or their representatives should collect their program's medals.

EVENT T-SHIRTS

Due to inflation pricing, shipping, and time constraints with manufacturers, we will not be selling regatta shirts this year. We do have some items left over from last year that will be for sale. If there is enough interest, we can open an online store, and individuals can have the items shipped to them from there.

FIRST AID & SAFETY

We are thankful to have the Johnson County Sherriff's Department for our Emergency and Water Rescue resource. Officers will have direct contact with local law enforcement and emergency personnel as needed.

First Aid will be available at the Registration Pavilion area. We encourage all teams to plan for weather, clothing, hydration and first aid/athletic training needs for your teams. If you need assistance, immediately notify a race official, volunteer or the Regatta Directors.
