## Racing Information

All information and updates will be posted on [VCRC Website \(www.vcrc.bc.ca\)](http://www.vcrc.bc.ca) and [RegattaCentral](http://RegattaCentral).

### Eligibility

The regatta is open to any registered member of an RCA rowing club. Competitors from outside Canada must be members of a rowing club which is a member of a National Rowing Federation recognized by FISA.

*U15 (Jr C)	14 or under as of Dec. 31 of the current year
*U17 (Jr B)	16 or under as of Dec. 31 of the current year
*U19 (Jr A)	18 or under as of Dec. 31 of the current year
U23	22 or under as of Dec. 31 of the current year

**JV	Junior Varsity

*\*VCRC supports RCA's Long Term Athlete Development plan which recognizes that children develop physically at different rates. Junior athletes may race one year down from their birth year, even if this places them in a different age class. This is to allow children who are "late developers" physically to train and race with athletes of similar developmental age.*

**\*\*Junior Varsity:** A JV category for some Junior boat classes allows athletes to get meaningful races by competing against boats of similar speed. The Regatta Committee encourages coaches to enter athletes in the category they think will provide the best race experience for their athletes. **You CANNOT enter an athlete in both JV and Varsity for the same event.** An athlete may race JV in one event and Varsity in a separate event.



Lwt W Lightweight Women - maximum weight 59 kg  
 Lwt M Lightweight Men - maximum weight 72.5 kg

*There is no weight average for a crew. All rowers in a lightweight crew must be at or under the maximum weight.*

*Lightweight athletes must weigh-in on the day of their event.*

 Coxswains are excluded from the age restriction and from calculation of average crew age.  
 Master athletes (age 21 and over) may compete in both OPEN and MASTER events.

NOVICE MASTER: Masters in their first two years of rowing.

\*\*\* All fees from the Family 2x and Dynasty 4xs support the VCRC Junior athletes travelling to regattas outside the Capital Regional District, including Junior National Team trials, Junior Worlds, and Royal Canadian Henley Regatta.

## Special Events

Registration for the following events will be accepted at the Registration table only up until noon on the day of the event.

Check RegattaCentral and VCRC website for additional details. Minimum 3 entries per event; Regatta Committee reserves the right to cap the number of entries.

## Progression System

Three (3) or more entries are required to run an event and award medals. Events with fewer than 3 entries may be combined. Where Master events have to be combined (i.e. when there are fewer than 3 entries per age category), handicaps will be applied.

### 1. TIME TRIALS (TT)

The following events will be grouped by boat class with athletes seeded into 6 boat finals based on time trial results. The first **16 spots** in each group will be seeded. **Please enter a seeding time (2k water time) in the space provided on the entry form.**

The intent of the time trial progression system is to create high quality, meaningful races for all competitors, based on boat speed rather than age. Medals are awarded for 1<sup>st</sup>, 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> place in the group (e.g., W1x), as well as in each category (e.g., U19 W1x). For example, if the top U19 woman places 3<sup>rd</sup> in Group 2 (W1x), she would be awarded 3<sup>rd</sup> place overall and 1<sup>st</sup> place in the U19 1x. Final placing by event is based on ranking not on times. For example, if U19 athlete "Jones" places 6<sup>th</sup> in Final A in a time of 7:30 and U19 athlete "Smith" places 1<sup>st</sup> in Final B in a time of 7:25, Jones is ranked higher and so is declared the winner of the U19 1x.

The Time Trial will be run on the morning of the scheduled finals for that group. The regatta committee reserves the right to cap the number of finals and to make 7 boat finals if necessary (e.g., to avoid 2 boat finals). If you are not able to stay for the event finals, you can race exhibition and your time will be recorded, however you will not be seeded into a final. If you scratch or do not show up for your final you will be assessed a \$30 scratch fee.

**Athletes may only enter ONE time trial event each day.**

Instructions on how time trials will be run will be posted on [RegattaCentral](#).

### 2. HEATS/SEMI-FINALS

For all other events, heats and semi-finals will be used to progress to Finals.

#### Race Schedule (Expected)

#### Flow of Events

**Timing of Semi Finals:** Scheduling of Semi Finals (for events that require them) will be determined as part of the Preliminary Schedule; they will be held either the same day as the Heats or the same day as the Final.

**Friday:** Friday Heats, Saturday heats, Friday Finals, (Saturday Semi-Finals- tentative)

**Saturday:** Time Trials, Sunday Heats, TT Finals (C,B,A Finals in each event followed by E-H), Saturday Finals

**Sunday:** Time Trials, (Sunday Semi-Finals- tentative, Sunday Finals, TT Finals (C,B,A Finals in each event, followed by E-H)

The final race schedule will depend on the number of entries in each event. The Preliminary Schedule will be posted June 30.

#### Training Times on the course

The course will be open for practice 7:00 am Friday and will close 1 hr hour before the first race. Coaches are asked to provide Safety



Boat coverage (please see the Safety Co-ordinator or VCRC Club Manager, Brenda Taylor).

The race course will be open for practice for 1 hr following the last race on Friday and Saturday.

The race course will **not** be open for training on Saturday or Sunday morning.

### **Coaches/Coxswains Meeting**

One hour before first scheduled race/time trial on Friday and Saturday.

### **Weigh Ins**

Scales will be open 90 minutes before the first scheduled race/ time trial on each day and will close 30 minutes prior to the start of the first scheduled race/time trial each day. Lightweight athletes must weigh-in on the day of their event. Coxswains are not required to weigh in.

### **Race Course and Distances**

Six lanes with four lines of buoys (i.e. 2 boats will race between each line of buoys). The finish line will be in the same place for all events. PLEASE consult the course and traffic flow maps (posted on [RegattaCentral](#), the [VCRC website](#) and at the boathouse) before launching. Crews deviating from the designated flow pattern will receive a yellow card.

### **Race distances**

Junior, U23 and Open :1850m, Master: 1000m, PARA: 1000m, Special Events (Dynasty 4x and Family 2x) 500m, Time Trials: 1750m,

### **Rules of Racing**

Except where already noted [RCA Rules of Racing](#) will be applied during this regatta.

### **Safety**

All shells must be equipped with a secure bow ball and heel restraints (ties no more than 7cm) or quick release mechanisms. All shells will be inspected prior to launching. Crews must adhere to safety protocols (flow pattern etc).

## **Entries and Fees**

**Registration Opens:** Monday May 29, 2017

**Register Online through [RegattaCentral](#).** All entries must indicate crew complement. If you do not know crew composition during registration, please contact the Registrar [vcrcregattas@gmail.com](mailto:vcrcregattas@gmail.com). **Please make sure your email address on the RegattaCentral account is valid and current so we can contact you if necessary.**

**Entry deadline:** Monday June 26, 2017, noon. *Entries must be complete by deadline, including payment, or late fees will apply.*

**Entry fee:** \$70/athlete (includes 5% GST). Entry fee includes RBC fee of \$4/day and entry into **unlimited** events (excluding the Family 2x and Dynasty 4x). **Athletes wishing to row only a single event may pay \$40 (includes 5% GST).**

**Entry fee for Family 2x:** \$30/boat (GST included)

**Entry fee for Dynasty 4x:** \$60/boat (GST included)

**Late entry fee:** (submitted after the entry deadline) \$90/person (if athlete is not already entered in other events) or \$25 per additional late event (if athletes are already registered in other events by the June 26 deadline). Late entries will be accepted up until noon on Monday, July 3, providing there is lane space available.

**Scratch Fees:** Scratch fees of **\$30 per boat** (includes 5% GST) will apply after the entry deadline. Crews that scratch from or do not show for a FINAL will be assessed a \$30 (includes 5% GST) fee. **This fee is meant to reflect the effort involved in creating the draw and to respect other athletes whose races are affected by late scratches.**

*Scratch fees are assessed at the discretion of the Registrar and typically will not be assessed if the scratch is necessary because of a scheduling conflict created by elimination of events or placement of heats.*

**Bow Markers:** Time Trial participants who fail to return their bow marker by noon on the day of the event will be assessed a \$10 (GST included) replacement fee.

**Change Fees:** Changes to Master crews that affect the age handicaps will be accepted without charge until **noon June 26**. After then a \$20 (includes 5% GST) athlete change fee applies to each change request that affects the age handicap in a Master event, unless the replaced athlete is being replaced for medical reasons (medical certificate required).



**Payment:** Please pay fees electronically through RegattaCentral. (If you are not able to pay online, please contact [vcrcregattas@vcrc.bc.ca](mailto:vcrcregattas@vcrc.bc.ca) to make alternative arrangements.) All payment must be received by RegattaCentral 9 am July 7 to avoid paying late entry fees.

## **Regatta Site**

### **Boat Storage**

Boats may be stored on the grassy area behind the boathouse. Security will be on-site Friday and Saturday nights.

### **Trailer Parking**

Trailers must be parked in the designated areas, there is NO trailer parking in the main parking lots. Please contact Brenda Taylor in the VCRC office if you would like directions on where to park.

### **Security**

There will be security on site Thursday, Friday and Saturday nights 8 pm-5 am

### **Vehicle Parking**

There are two parking lots at the regatta site available for vehicles other than trailers. Additional parking is available at the north end of the lake at Hamsterly Beach (Sayward Rd. exit off Pat Bay Highway), a 15 minute walk from the regatta site, or south of the lake at Jennings Lane (before Haliburton Rd) or at Beaver Lake, a 30 minute walk from the regatta site.

No vehicles may use or park on the gravel service road to the boathouse or in the motor boat launch area.

Parking on the Pat Bay Highway is not allowed. Be warned that vehicles parked on the Highway have a high risk of being towed and/or ticketed without warning by the Saanich Police.

### **Medical Services**

First Aid will be available for on-site for emergencies.

### **Registration Table**

Registration packages may be picked up at the registration table starting Friday 8 am.

### **Time Trials**

**Bow numbers for time trials MUST be picked up the day before the Time Trial event.**

Sat. TT: Pick up bow markers before 7pm on Fri and return to registration desk by noon on Saturday.

Sun. TT: Pick up bow marker noon-5pm on Sat and return to registration desk before noon on Sunday.

### **Location**

Victoria City Rowing Club is located at Eagle Beach on Elk Lake, adjacent to Pat Bay Highway (Hwy #17) in Victoria, BC. The club is a 15-minute drive north from Downtown Victoria, a 25-minute drive south from the Swartz Bay Ferry Terminal and a 15-minute drive south from the Victoria International Airport.

## **Special Notes:**

- A 10 hp engine restriction will be in place and enforced during this regatta to minimize boat wake.
- VCRC is making an effort to reduce the amount of waste produced at the regatta. Please help us by using the designated recycling and composting bins and bringing your own reusable water bottle. Victoria tap water is great to drink!
